City of Canberra tail repaint

During December and January our 747-438 "City of Canberra" received a fresh coat of red paint to the tail and rear fuselage.

As many visitors may have noticed the red paint on the tail and fuselage had become very faded. The project to repaint had been on the "to do" list for some time but had to wait until the weather was favourable.

The repaint involved first cleaning the surfaces using both high pressure water blasters and good old elbow grease. The top of the tail, being some 20 metres above the ground, required an extra long-reach boom lift to be brought in. The lower sections were accessible using HARS own equipment.

The application of paint on an aircraft is normally done using spray equipment. However, as it was impractical to encapsulate the tail to facilitate spraying, conventional hand powered paint rollers were used.

Guided tours of hangar three were available throughout the weekend and engines were run briefly on the AP-3C Orion and the Vampire.





Convair CV-440

In January work on the installation of engine two was completed and the engineers have performed a successful engine run. Although routine maintenance on the aircraft is still in progress, the engine installation and test runs are a major milestone in returning the aircraft to serviceable condition. It is anticipated the Convair will return to flying within the next few months.

Did You Know...

...the Convair B-58 "Hustler" was the world's first operational bomber capable of travelling at Mach 2? It first flew in 1956 and became operational in 1960 but was retired in 1970. The B-58 was replaced by the General Dynamics F-111A in the USAF.

...the thrust from each the Boeing 747-400's engines is approximately 58,000 lbs, which is nearly double the thrust of the original 747-100 engine?

...the typical rotation speed of an Airbus A380 is approximately 150 knots, with the take-off roll being approximately 2,900 metres?
