Australian Aviation Hall of Fame

The Australian Aviation Hall of Fame (AAHOF) has announced it will relocate from its current temporary home in Wagga Wagga to the HARS Aviation Museum facility at Illawarra Regional Airport.

AAHOF was founded in 2010 to recognise contributions and achievements of individuals and organisations in Australian aviation. With the support of Shellharbour Council and significant input from HARS, Illawarra Regional Airport was selected as AAHOF's permanent home over several other possible locations.

Upgrades to HARS facilities continue

The ongoing upgrades to the HARS premises continue. Work is well advanced on the installation of a passenger lift in hangar two. This will also be an important piece of infrastructure to support the Australian Aviation Hall of Fame and represents compliance with one of the conditions required for the granting of the final certificate of occupancy.

Shellharbour Council to upgrade Illawarra Regional Airport

Shellharbour City Council has announced a \$14M upgrade to Illawarra Regional Airport to support a return of regular public transport (RPT) services. Details of the airline are yet to be announced but flights are expected to be offered to Brisbane and Melbourne.

Extension and resurfacing of Runway 08/26 and construction of a temporary terminal facility have already taken place. More permanent structures and planned security upgrades account for the remainder of the \$14m funding allocation.

Aircraft News

Douglas C-47 Dakota A65-94 has had annual inspections completed and returned to the air. Saturday 24 June saw the aircraft perform several take-offs and landings to enable the crews to maintain their currency on type. The cross wind on the day made the pilots work just a little harder than normal!





Neptune P2V-7, 566 (our ex French Navy aircraft) undertook a number of engine runs during the June Tarmac Days, as part of ongoing work to restore that aircraft to airworthiness.

Work has commenced to change the starboard engine on Convair CV-440, VH-TAA following some mechanical issues encountered earlier this year.

Did You Know...

...that the Convair B-36D strategic bomber had 10 engines? It was fitted with six Pratt and Whitney R-4360, 28 cylinder radial engines, plus four General Electric J47 turbojets. The aircraft had a wingspan of 70.12 metres and a range of 8,700 nautical miles.

...that the Boeing 707-138B (built to Qantas requirements and the type that has been gifted to HARS by John Travolta) was a higher performance version of the standard 707? It was about three metres shorter and had more powerful engines giving better short field performance and greater range. The first one delivered to Qantas, VH-EBA, was the first 707 sold to a carrier outside the USA.

...that the little holes in the bottom of airliner passenger windows are to regulate air pressure between middle and outer panes? Most pressurised aircraft have three acrylic panes per window – the outer being the primary window, the middle acts as a failsafe should the outer window fail and the inner is to protect the middle pane.
