Australia's Aviation Heritage

Happy New Year!

The Committee and members of HARS wish all our subscribers a safe, healthy and prosperous new year.

For HARS, 2019 holds the promise of more exciting developments at our two museums – HARS Aviation Museum at Illawarra Regional Airport and HARS Aviation Museum Parkes at Parkes airport in western NSW. Projects underway include:

John Travolta's Boeing 707-138

Progress toward bringing this historic aircraft to Australia has been slowed by some complex regulatory requirements to enable the aircraft to fly both in the USA and Australia. However, this is still very much an active HARS project and it is hoped significant progress will be made in 2019.

Southern Cross II restoration

As readers of this newsletter would be aware, there has been an enormous amount of progress on this restoration in 2018. The last major pieces of work to be completed include installation of the two under wing engines and testing and certification of the aircraft. This work should be completed this year enabling the aircraft to return to flying status.





Fokker F27 Friendship

The flight from New Zealand to Australia of our second Fokker F27 is imminent. There have been some delays due to weather and pilot availability, but once these two factors can be aligned the aircraft will transfer to Australia. Ultimately one of the aircraft will be transferred to our Parkes museum with the other remaining at Illawarra Regional Airport.

HARS Aviation Museum Parkes

As noted above the Parkes museum is soon to receive a Fokker F27 Friendship. Other plans for 2019 include completion of restoration to static display of P2V-7 Neptune A89-272 and reassembly for static display of Neptune P2V-5 A89-302, which was recently recovered from RAAF Base Williams at Point Cook in Victoria.





2018 the year in review

Some of the achievements and noteworthy events for HARS Aviation Museum in 2018 include:

- de Havilland DHA-3 Drover returned to airworthy condition,
- Lockheed AP-3C Orion, A9-759 handed over to the HARS Aviation Museum Parkes,
- The first of two Fokker F27 Friendships was ferried across the Tasman to Illawarra Regional Airport,
- T.35 Vampire A79-637 received its overhauled de Havilland Goblin engine. The goal of this project is to return this Vampire to airworthy condition,
- Significant progress on restoration of Fokker Trimotor "Southern Cross II" with the wing, undercarriage, horizontal stabilizers, rudder and one engine installed,
- Oz Flight Sim Expo held at HARS Aviation Museum. This was particularly successful, and the organisers intend to make HARS their venue for future expos,
- HARS Aviation Museum wins Travellers Choice Awards for top 10 museums in Australia and top 25 in the South Pacific,
- HARS successfully tendered for the RAN Historic Flight aircraft collection, a welcome addition to our collection with many historic aircraft included.





Aircraft activity in December

Several aircraft were active during December. The de Havilland DHA-3 Drover conducted training flights on a number of occasions after some minor maintenance work. Douglas C-47B Dakota, A65-094 made a flight to HMAS Albatross, Nowra and high speed taxi runs were performed by our Lockheed AP-3C Orion, A9-753 and P2V-7 Neptune, A89-273.

Wing walk times are between 10am and 3pm at a special introductory price of \$65 which includes museum entry.

Please note that fully enclosed, flat (no heels) footwear must be worn. Ladies must wear shorts or pants - please no skirts. This is to facilitate the fitting of a snug safety harness. All wing walks are subject to weather conditions and may not be available on all days.
