HARS Parkes Aviation Museum

As always there has been much activity at our Parkes Museum.

Lockheed 12 reassembly

Work has commenced on reassembling our Lockheed 12A Junior Electra, c/n 1275. This aircraft was once registered VH-BHH and, was built at the Lockheed Burbank facility in 1939.

The aircraft was initially civilian registered but in March 1942 it was impressed into service with the United Sates Army Air Force and subsequently transferred to the Royal Air Force under lend/lease arrangements.

After WWII it returned to civilian duties and was briefly owned by Sidney Cotton. For those who are not familiar with Cotton's "espionage" flights over Germany pre-WWII, it is worth doing a google search to learn more.

The aircraft came to Australia in 1952 and initially flew for Silver City Airways before eventually being sold to Bush Church Aid Society, Australia, and Tasmania. It was severely damaged in a landing accident at Ceduna in 1960 and was subsequently cancelled from the Australian Aircraft Register in November 1960. Since 1960 the aircraft has had various owners until gifted to HARS.

C-47 to be added to the Parkes collection

HARS acquired Ex US Army Air Force C-47, "Oklahoma Girl" in 2021. Currently the fuselage section is still at Caboolture airport, with the wings at Albion Park. During this year it is planned to transport the aircraft components to HARS Parkes Museum, where it will be reassembled for static display.

Tracker 844 flies again

HARS Navy Heritage Fleet's Grumman Tracker 844 finally took to the skies over Shellharbour Regional Airport over the first weekend in April. The aircraft has spent two and a half years in maintenance, being a ten yearly inspection and including an annual inspection.

On Saturday she was all set to fly to the Canberra Airport open day, but inclement weather, which prevented our aircraft from flying to Canberra, unfortunately forced cancellation of HARS participation in the event.

Now 844 is again certified to fly it is expected she will be a regular flying attraction, particularly on Tarmac Weekends.

Planned future flying activities

Future planned activities include Anzac Day. HARS has traditionally supported ANZAC day commemorations by flying over various ANZAC Day services in the Illawarra and the City of Sydney. This year is no exception with several aircraft expected to be in the air.

Tarmac days over the next several months should also see more HARS aircraft flying.

City of Canberra – Boeing 747-438 tours

HARS is now able to accept bookings for tours of our Boeing 747-438 'City of Canberra'.

Wing Walk Experience

The Wing Walk will provide you with a unique perspective of the 747 taking you about sixteen meters (52 feet) along the right wing where your guide will explain many aspects of the aircraft components and operation. Wing Walk times are between 10am and 3pm for the price of \$70, which includes museum entry.

The Total Boeing 747 Experience

This premium tour commences with a brief audio-visual presentation followed by a tour of the entire aircraft, including the cabin and galleys, crew rest areas, the avionics bay, forward cargo hold and a detailed inspection of the cockpit. Conducted by experienced 747 crew, the tour duration is approximately 4 hours and includes a personalised tour of the full HARS museum. The tour is priced at \$200 per person with a maximum of four persons per tour.



747 Cockpit Experience

The cockpit tour is conducted by an experienced 747 pilot who will explain the cockpit in detail and will take you through the many procedures required to mount a typical operation. Bookings are limited to two guests per tour, the cost is \$105 per person and includes museum entry.
